

Then we visited the Korean, Vietnam, Lincoln, Air Force and Iwo Jima Memorials. One thing our group liked most was the "police escort" which cleared traffic enabling an otherwise impossible mission. The whirlwind tour finished in time to witness the changing of the guard at the Tomb of the Unknowns at Arlington National Cemetery followed by a banquet and mail-call. The patriotism on display in DC confirmed the appreciation our citizens have for veterans! The RI Fire Chiefs team has created a tradition worthy of our support. I am confident neither Billie nor I will ever forget this day. I am grateful I had the honor to be Billie's guardian and would recommend volunteering for or donating to the Honor Flight program.
